## UK General Election results from 1997-2019 featuring alternative PR results.

A little caveat regarding the figures on the enclosed documents, while the figures shown are a true representation of the results they are intended to aid discussion about the existing and potential new voting systems, not all the figures are exactly correct some of them may be slightly out though that doesn't affect the results shown.

The purpose of this information is to demonstrate the unfairness of our current electoral system and how a majority of the electorate are disenfranchised. A system that allows a party to form a majority government with support from a minority of the electorate, see for yourself.

Showing an alternative system of seats awarded as a percentage of votes cast in a proportional system demonstrates the impact such a change could have along with the ability to reject all parties with a none of the above option.

The data shown treats non voters as rejecting all parties and candidates while accepting there are various reasons why people don't vote.

The smaller parties shown on the later tables of course only stand in certain parts of the country and I have shown some of them to demonstrate this point but if they are standing for the Westminster parliament then their vote share should be counted against the whole UK?

Others includes a lot of smaller parties that achieved such a small vote share it barely registered, should there be a threshold for the number of votes needed to be included in any allocation of seats.
